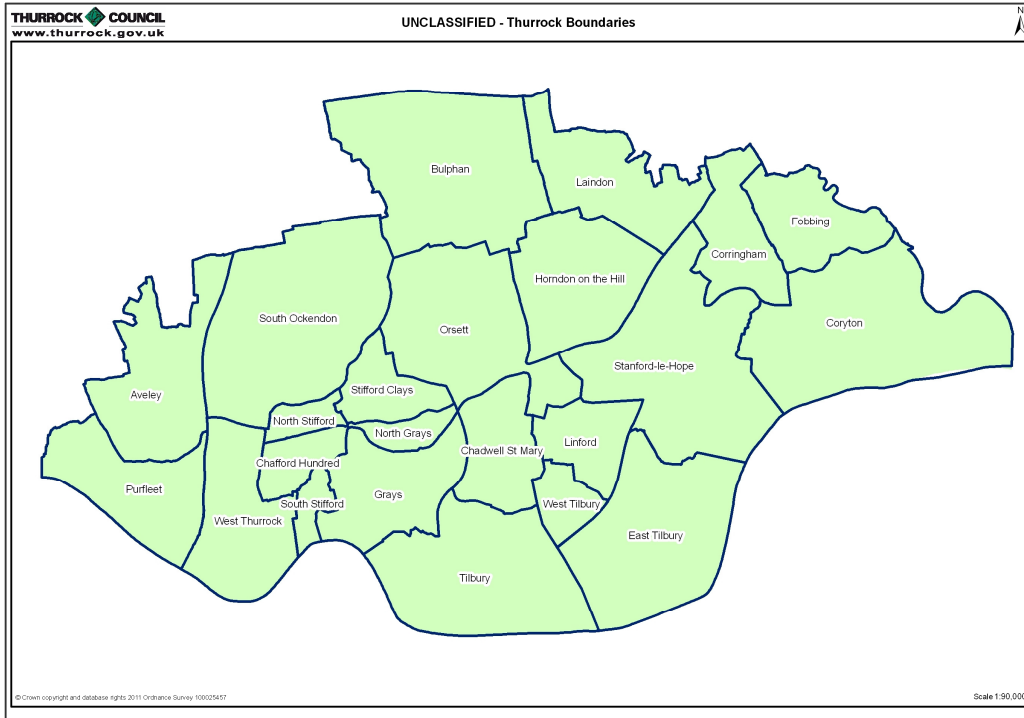


APPENDIX 1:

DETAILED INFORMATION ABOUT EACH PLANNING AREA PRIMARY SCHOOLS

Thurrock is divided into 'Planning Areas' for the purpose of projecting and reviewing the demand from pupils needing places against the school capacity available in an 'area'. The areas are geographically defined by significant topographical features including major roads, railway lines, streams etc, or by the nature of their isolation, for example, the small vill

ages in the area. Individual school's circumstances are taken into account as part of the area planning. Area reviews allow a more targeted analysis of school places and give a better picture of the sufficiency/deficiency of places for an area. Different planning areas face different issues that will require different strategies in order to manage them successfully.

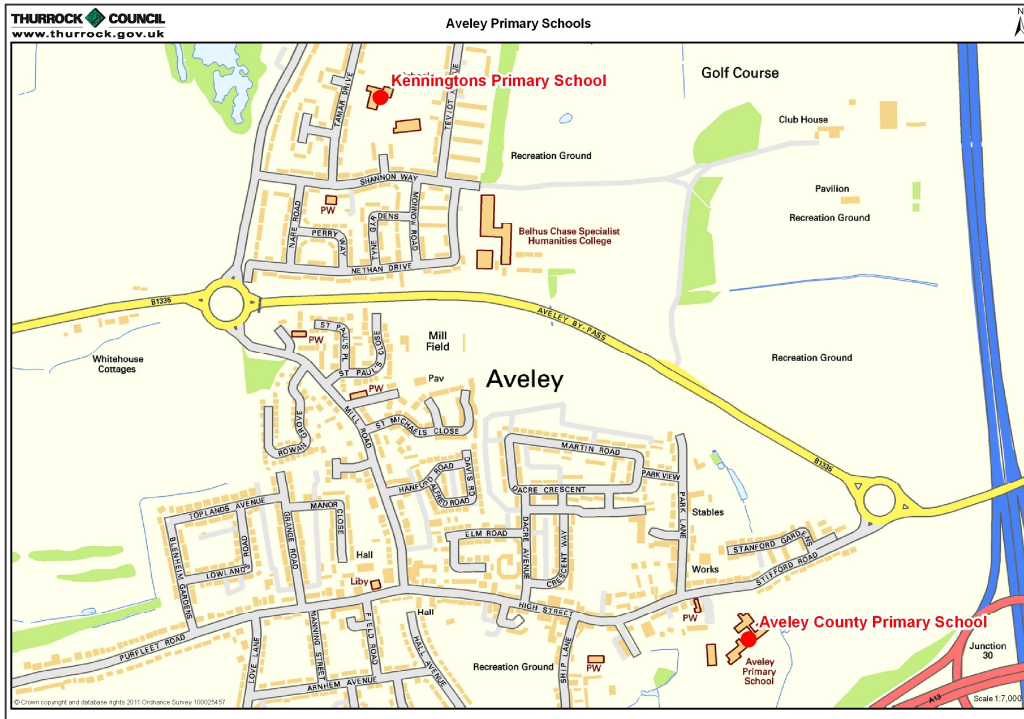


Thurrock operates 12 primary planning areas.

PRIMARY PLANNING AREA: AVELEY



GENERAL

Aveley is in the west of the Borough. It is roughly bounded to the north and west by the London Borough of Havering, to the south by the A13 road and to the east by the M25 motorway. Its admission area is geographically separated from the rest of the Borough by the M25, although there is a vehicle and pedestrian bridge over the motorway connecting Aveley to South Ockendon.

Aveley consists of an existing village and post war development, with a primary school situated in each. The original village has a turn of the century school with an additional building added in the 1950's. The newer primary and the secondary school for the area are in a large 1950's housing development.

There are two schools in this planning area:

- Aveley Primary School
- Kenningtons Primary School.

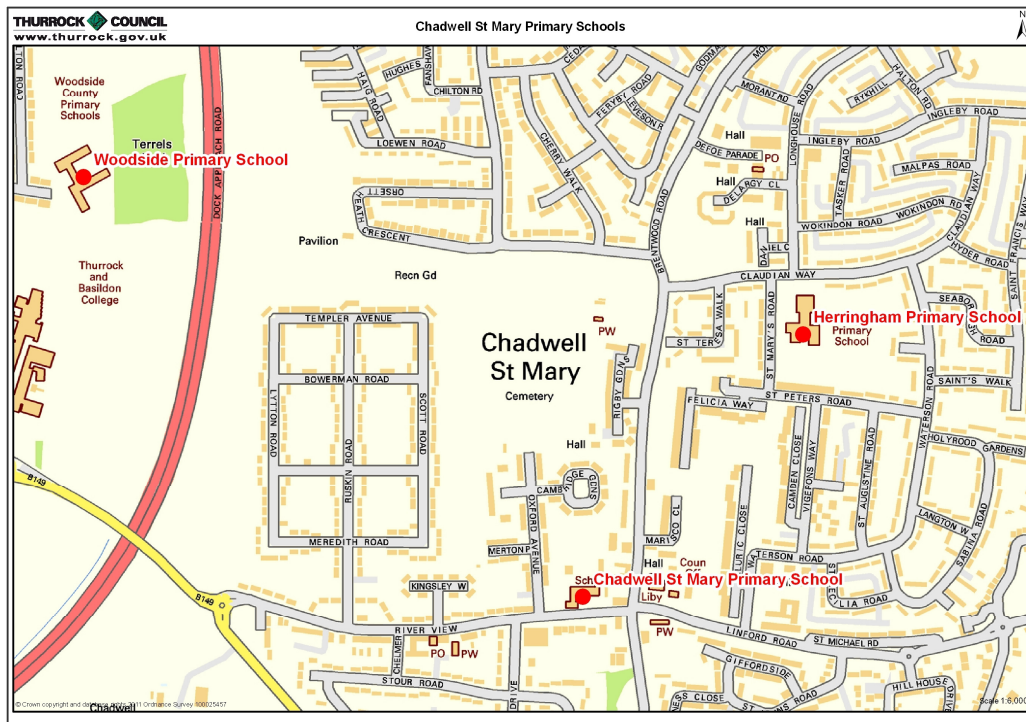

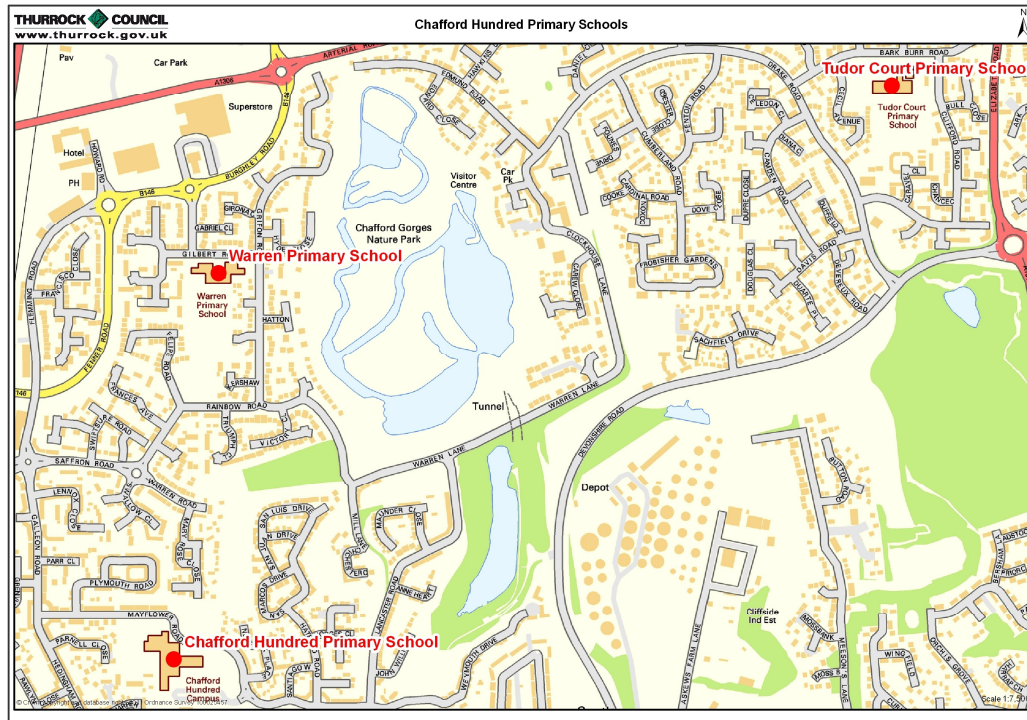

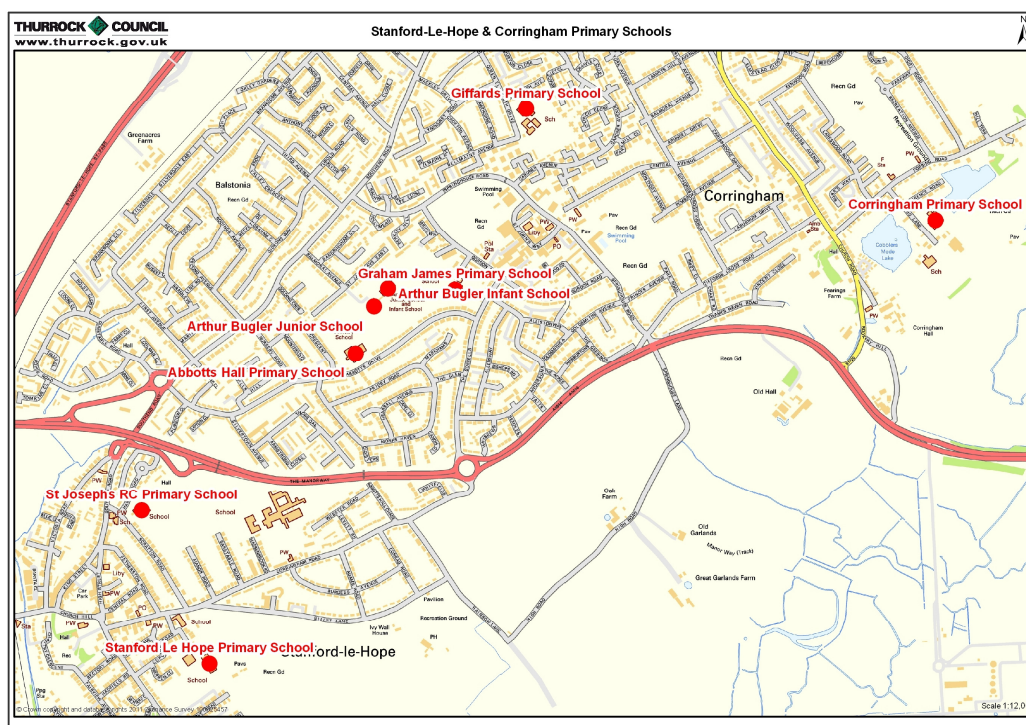

PRIMARY PLANNING AREA: CORRINGHAM & STANFORD-LE-HOPE



GENERAL

Corringham and Stanford-Le-Hope lie in the east of the Borough, in a discrete population area. One of the main local industries is the nearby oil refinery at Shell Haven, and it soon will be home to the proposed DP World deep sea port, major business and logistics park.

Stanford-le-Hope is bordered to the north by the A13 road and to the south by the Thames Estuary. It is located 12.7 miles (20.5 km) west of Southend-on-Sea.

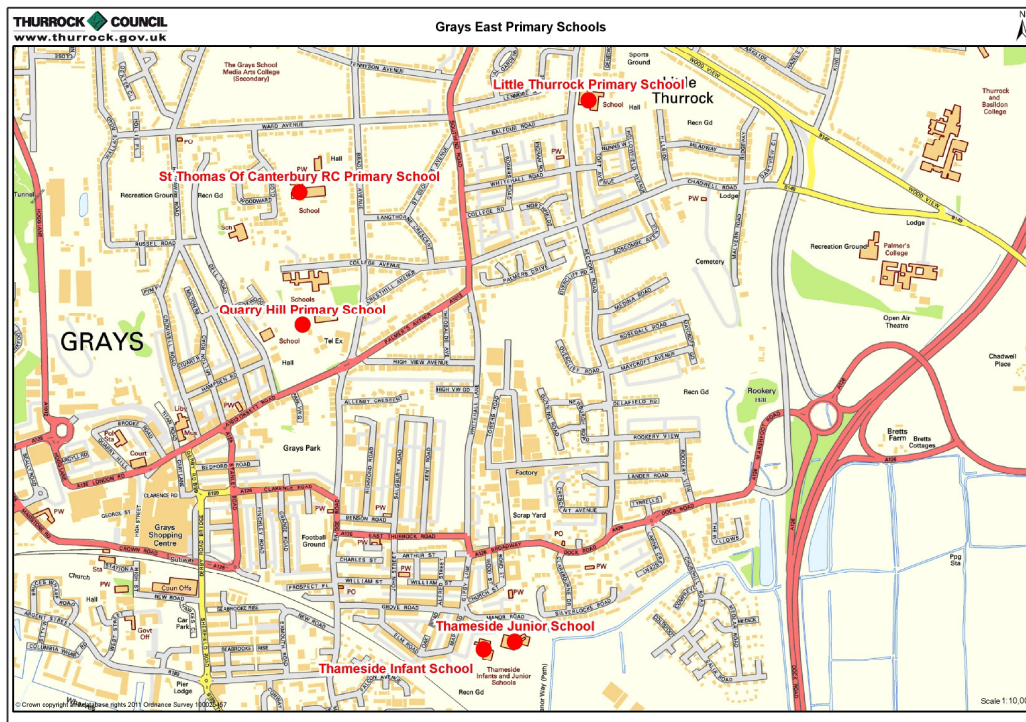

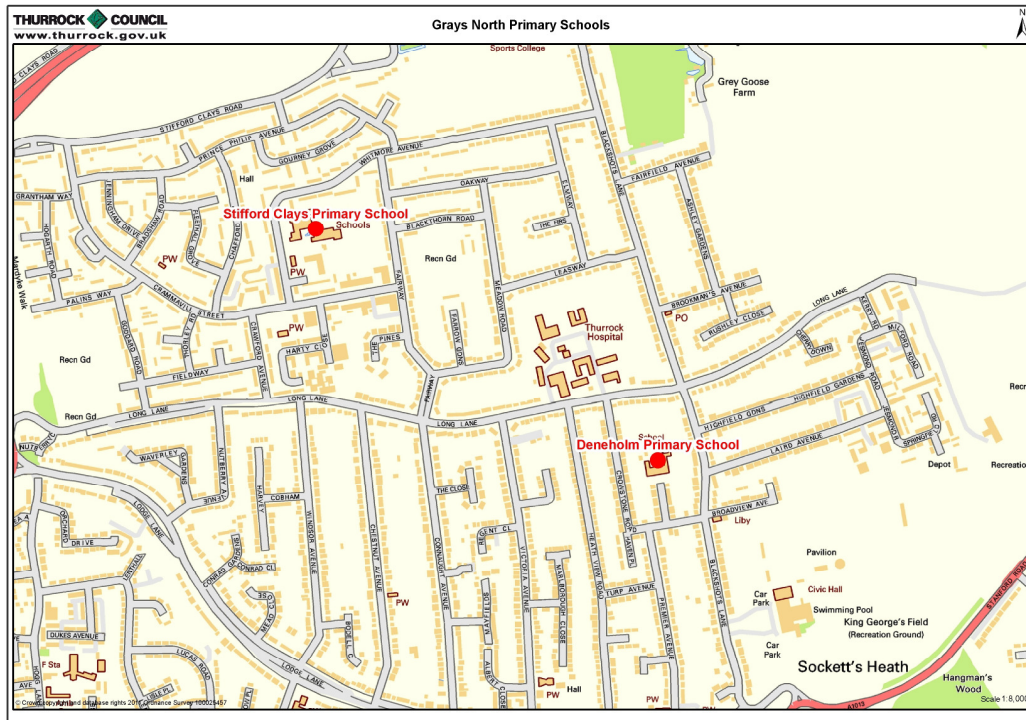

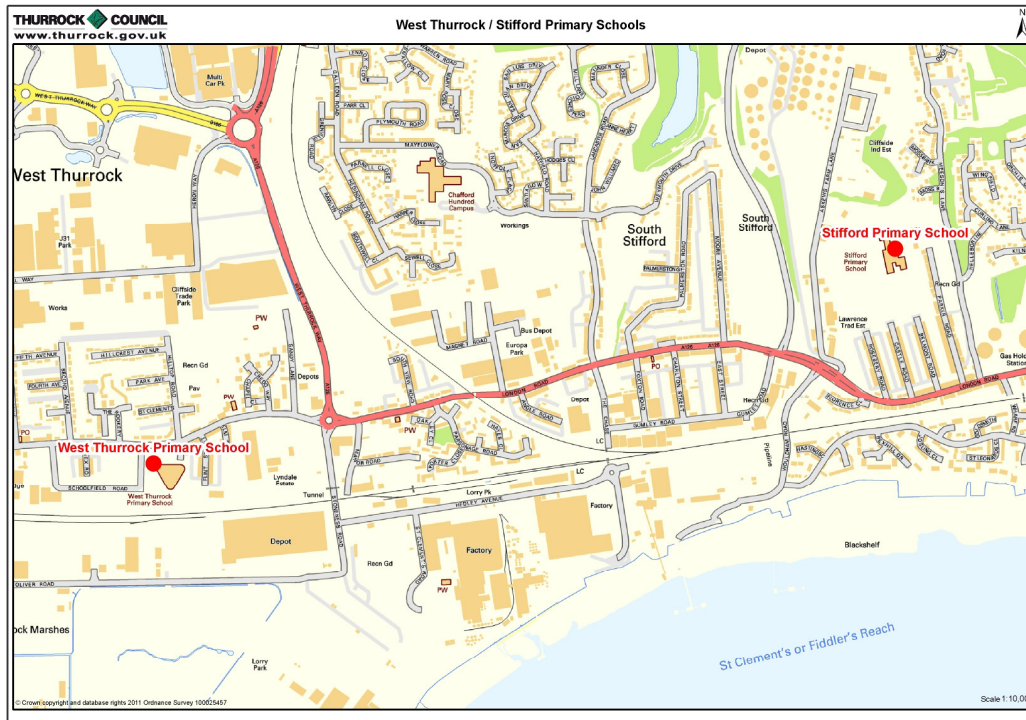

West Thurrock lies to the east of Chafford Hundred and Grays and is served by one primary school, with a nursery class. The area has a mix of heavy and light industry and residential estates built as the employment along the river has increased

South Stifford separates Grays town centre from West Thurrock and Lakeside Shopping Centre. It acts as a residential area for people working in many of the towns factories and surrounding retail areas.

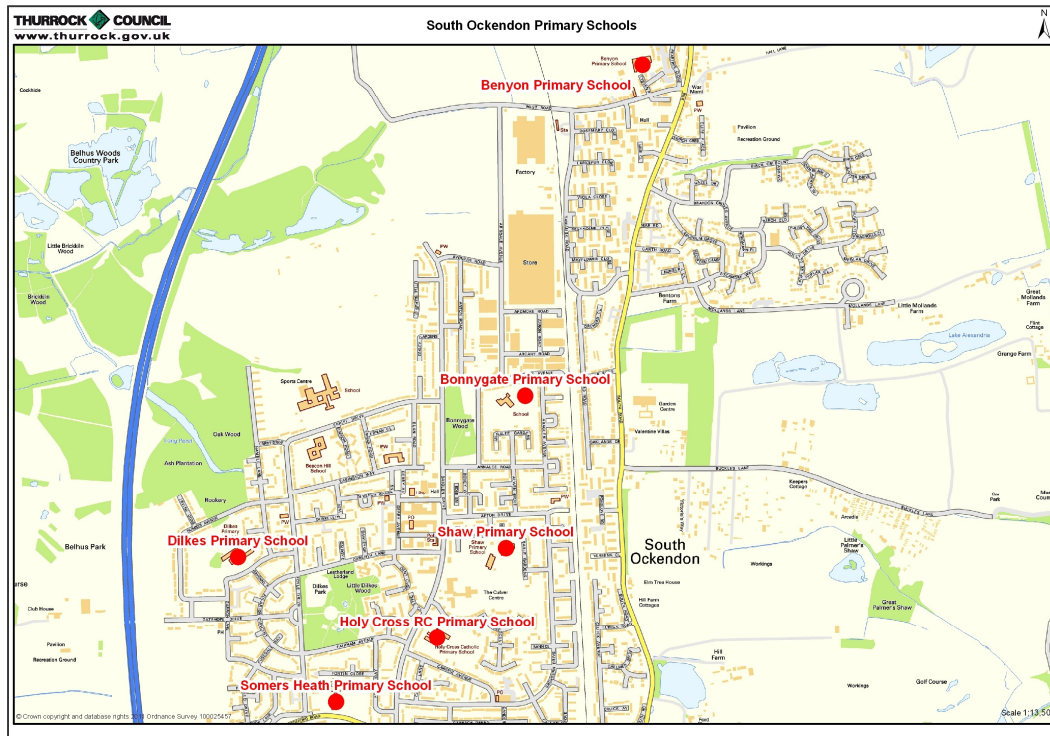

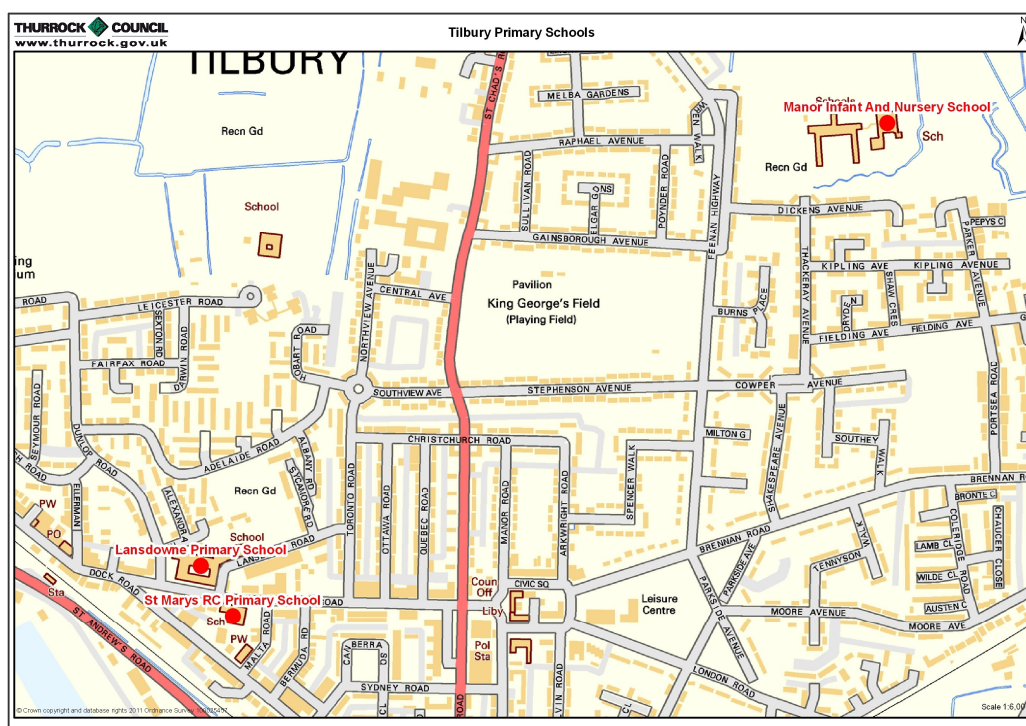

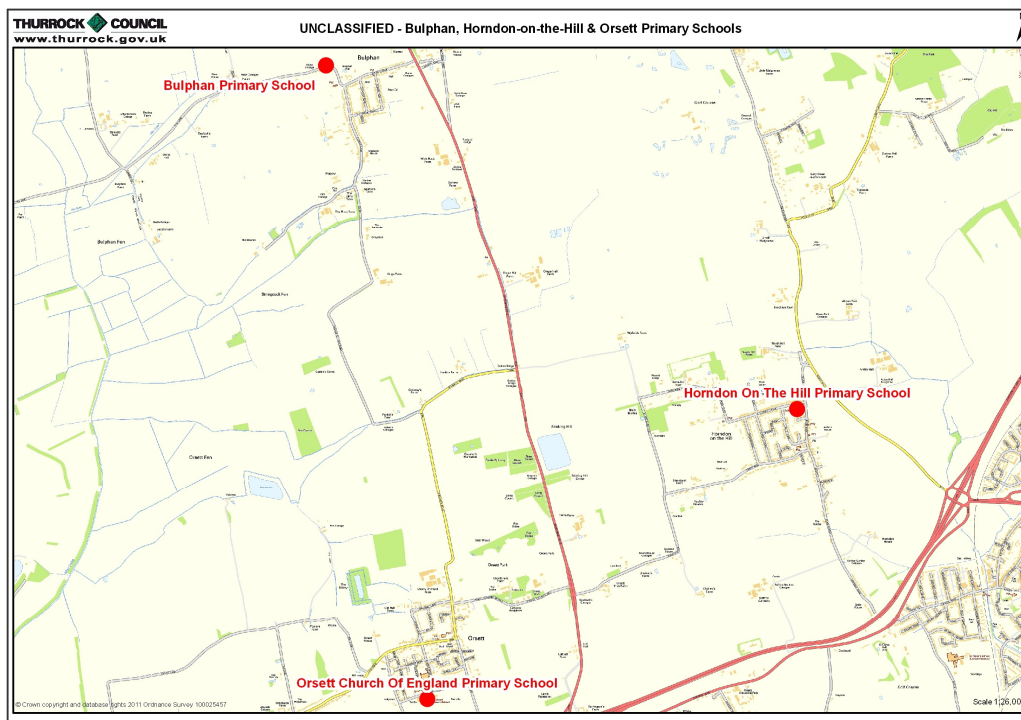
