I had several residents who were not at all happy with the location of this polling station. Several of the residents lived in the Cullen Square and Cruick Avenue area. The Polling station is a good distance from their properties. Many of the elder residents like to take their vote to the Polling Booth rather than have a postal vote. I cannot understand why a booth could not be set up in the Foxglove Bridge area. Bearing in mind it is a portacabin based in the Thurrock Garden Centre. Toilet facilities are an issue. I am sure that Chestnut Farm would accomodate and allow use of their public toilet.
The South Ockendon Youth Centre has been used for polling in the Belhus Ward (F - Culverhouse). The Youth Centre is located within the Culver Centre. This building will be available as a polling station in 2014 but it is highly unlikely to be available for elections held in 2015. A new location for polling will be required.
UPDATE: The Returning Officer considers the Youth Centre to be a suitable location for 2014 but is keen to identify suitable alternative locations within the polling district for 2015.
SUMMARY OF RESPONSE - agree with the location of the Thurrock Garden Centre as a polling station and offers alternative to Culver Centre as the Holy Cross School or Shaw School
