This policy statement is an addendum to the Council's approach to the scheme changes that came into effect from 1 April 2008 and discretionary decisions relating to the Local Government Pension Scheme regulations.

This policy decisions covers early release of deferred benefits on compassionate grounds under the Local Government Pension scheme regulations 1995, Local Government Pension Scheme Regulations 1997 and Local Government Pension Scheme (Benefit, Membership and Contributions) Regulations 2007.
