Impact of Proposal on public / services	The Regeneration Service has recently secured £4.3m through the TIGER programme which comes at an annual cost to the Council of £60k (see separate growth item). It was anticipated that this additional cost would be met from within the existing project budget. Set alongside this increased burden, the £67k in 2013/14 is likely to have a significant impact on the operation of the Service, representing a 27% cut on the projects budget. This would most likely see all activity ceasing on schemes in Grays and Tilbury as funds are diverted into the active programme in Purfleet.
