Executive Summary

An application has been received for a review of the Premises licence at the Lounge Bar, Unit 4, Lakeside Business Village, Fleming Road, Chafford Hundred, Essex RM16 6YA. The review relates to two of the four Licensing Objectives: Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. During the consultation a further representation has been received from the Licensing Authority in relation to the four Licensing Objectives.

1. Recommendation(s)

1.1 That the Sub-Committee

a) Considers this report and appendices together with any oral submissions at the hearing and determines the application for the review of the premises licence.

2. Introduction and Background

- 2.1 On 7th July 2016, an application for a Review was received from Chief Inspector Leigh Norris, of Essex Police, Grays Police Station, Grays, Essex, RM17 5BX. A copy of the application is attached as **Appendix A**
- 2.2 The application for Review relates to the following licensing objectives-

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- Recent visits to the premise have disclosed that on two separate occasions a number of conditions of the Premises Licence were not being complied with.
- On 22nd May 2016, CCTV from the premise shows that sales of alcohol were taking place more than one hour after the terminal hour for the sale

Public Safety

• On 22nd May 2016 a very serious incident took place at the premise when three customers were seriously injured following a number of fights. Two of these customers received stab wounds whilst the third suffered various fractures to his face. All three were recorded as GBH

The review application is also accompanied by a report of all incidents and statements from Police Officers who attended the premises.

- 2.3 There has also been a representation received from the Licensing Authority. This representation is attached as **Appendix B.**
- 2.4 Under the Licensing Act 2003 the licensing objectives are
 - (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - (b) public safety;
 - (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - (d) the protection of children from harm.
- 2.5 Any representation must relate to a particular premise and must be relevant to the promotion of one or more of the four licensing objectives.
- 2.6 Since the review application was made, an application to transfer the premises licence and vary the DPS has been made and accepted. A copy of the current licence is attached as **Appendix C.**

3. Issues, Options and Analysis of Options

- 3.1 The Committee, after considering the review application and all of the relevant representations, will need to consider what action, if any, to take in order to ensure that the Licensing Objectives are complied with.
- 3.2 The following options are available to the Licensing Sub-Committee:
 - Do nothing with the licence;
 - To modify the conditions of the premises licence. This can include adding new conditions or alterations to existing conditions e.g. reducing the hours of operation;
 - To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence e.g. to exclude regulated entertainment after a certain hour,

- To remove the Designated Premises Supervisor e.g. because it is considered that the problems are being caused by poor management;
- To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- To revoke the licence.
- 3.3 The decision made by the committee will not take effect until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision or, if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.
- 3.4 In determining this application for review of the premises licence, the Sub-Committee should have regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3.5 The Sub-Committee are advised that the hearing is a statutory exercise of power delegated by local residents to consider what the public interest requires. The licensing authority, via the Sub-Committee, has a duty, in accordance with the rule of law, to behave fairly in the decision-making procedure. Representations from all parties both written and verbal will form part of matters that are to be considered. Findings on issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
- 3.6 The Sub-Committee are advised that the final decision should be based on the individual merits of the application and findings of fact made at the hearing.
- 3.7 The application must be determined within 5 working days of the conclusion of the hearing, in accordance with paragraph 26 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The current Premises Licence Holder was transferred onto the license on the 14th April 2016. He was also varied on as Dps.

Since that date two Tier 1 Op.Benison inspections have revealed that various conditions on the Premise Licence were not being complied with.

Drug use was taking place in the toilets.

A very serious incident took place on the 22nd May 2016 where a number of fights took place, weapons were used and very serious injuries were sustained by 3 customers.

Since the incident two meetings have taken place with the Premises Licence Holder and letters have been hand delivered to him. Despite the urgency and seriousness of the situation to date he has failed to take any action.

Police v Lounge Bar

This is an application to Review the Premise Licence of Lounge Bar, Lakeside Business Village, Fleming Road, Chafford Hundred, Essex RM16 6YA.

The Premise is the holder of a Premise Licence No. 05/01298/LAPRE issued by the Licensing Authority of Thurrock Council. The Premise Licence Holder (PLH) and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) is Mr Ryan O'Connor, 22 Albany Road, Tilbury Essex RM18 7BF.

The current Premise Licence allows for ON and OFF Sales of Alcohol and other Licensable Activities to take place seven days per week.

Performance of Live Music

This premise was originally granted a Premise Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 many years ago.

Lounge Bar, originally called "Unit 4" has always been a family run business. i.e. The Premises Licence Holder Mr John O'Connor (father of Ryan O'Connor) and the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) Francis O'Connor (the mother of Ryan O'Connor). Mr Ryan O'Connor (their son) has taken an active role as a manager. Over this long period of time, until early 2016 this premise was seen by the police as being reasonably well operated.

On the 15th January 2016 a Police Licensing Inspection (Op.Benison), was carried out and a number of issues were noted. These issues mainly related to the cctv system and evidence of cocaine use in the toilets. During this inspection a conversation was had with Mr Ryan O'Connor who stated **t**hat an application to vary himself on as Designated Premises Supervisor (Dps) would be submitted in the near future.

Following this inspection a letter was sent by the Police to the then Premise Licence Holder Mr John O'Connor outlining the issues found.

On the 2nd February 2016 an application was made to the Licensing Authority to Transfer the Premise Licence and vary the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) to Mr Ryan 'Connor. The application was not initially seen as valid by the Licensing Authority and this resulted in a delay in the new Premises Licence being issued.

A second Police Licensing Inspection (Op. Benison) was carried out on the 12th February 2016. No issues were raised and the inspecting team were informed that the premise was closing on the 13th February 2016 to allow the re-fit to commence.

In March 2016 an application for a Minor Variation was made changing the name of the premise from Unit 4 to Lounge Bar and making alterations to the bar layout and toilets. Certain agreed conditions were to be added to the new Premises Licence when it was issued.

On the 15th April 2016 an in-depth Police Licensing Inspection (Op.Benison Tier 1 inspection) was carried out at the premise. It was noted at the time that the Licensing Authority had not yet sent out the New Premise Licence and this was handed to Mr Ryan O'Connor during the inspection. Mr Ryan O'Connor was now therefore both the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). There was an expectation that as the premise had only just re-opened that all the previous issues would have been rectified. This was not the case. There were several breaches of the Premise Licence. There was one door man on duty who was not wearing his SIA badge. He was unable to produce the badge but showed a picture on his mobile phone. He was sent home. Mr Ryan O'Connor was not present but the person in charge was made fully aware of breaches of conditions and a general police concern, as the poor operation of the premise. One of the police concerns was the apparent use of cocaine in the toilets. (Drug wipes used by police).

Breaches of conditions of Premises Licence:

Annex 2 Conditions:

Condition No. 3

The cctv system was not showing correct date.

Condition No. 8 Regular toilet checks not being carried out. Condition No. 9 No incident book available. Condition No. 10 No Challenge 25 posters being displayed.

Good practice:

No staff training records available.

The Police and the Licensing Authority were very disappointed and had expected to see a vast improvement in the running of the business.

A letter dated the 19th April 2016 was sent by the police to both the now Premise Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor Mr Ryan O'Connor. This letter stated to him quite clearly the number of breaches of conditions.

A further in-depth Police Licensing Inspection (Op.Benison Tier 1 inspection) was carried out again at the premise on the 20th May 2016. Mr Ryan O'Connor was present on this occasion. Whilst there had been some improvement in the operation of the premise the Police still had concerns. The doorman on duty was unable to produce his badge to the Police (a check revealed that he did in fact hold a current SIA front line door staff badge).

Usage of cocaine was still apparent in the toilets (drug wipes used by police).

Breaches of conditions of Premises Licence:

Annex 2 Conditions: Conditions No. 8 Regular toilet checks not being carried out. The paperwork was out of date. Condition No. 10 No Challenge 25 posters being displayed.

Mr Ryan O'Connor was made fully aware of the issues. It was the intention of the Police Licensing Officer to forward a letter to Mr O'Connor outlining the above. Events of the same weekend negated the drafting of this letter.

On 01:44hrs of the 22nd May 2016 a very serious incident occurred at the premise. This incident resulted in 3 patrons receiving GBH injuries. The incident occurred immediately outside the rear of the premise which was not covered by cctv cameras. A number of fights had broken out involving many of customers. One male received stab injuries to his hand, right forearm and the back of his upper arm. A second male received two stab injuries to his upper arm. The third victim was assaulted, kicked to floor which caused multiple fractures to his face. He was found in an alleyway nearby. All three victims required hospital treatment with the third male being admitted for specialist treatment at the Royal London Hospital. All three victims had been customers at the premise.

As a result of enquiries made the police have arrested two male suspects who are currently on bail while the investigation continues.

When the Police Licensing Officer later viewed cctv footage of this very serious incident it was noted that the premise had continued to allow the sale of alcohol past its terminal hour of 00:30hrs. Sales being noted at 01:29, 01:42 and 01:53hrs. The closing of the premise is 01:30hrs and it is apparent that this not being complied with.

It may well be that had the Premises Licence Holder conformed to the terminal hours set out in his Premises Licence the very serious incident may not have taken place.

The Police Licensing Officer returning to duty on Monday 23rd May 2016 telephoned Mr Ryan O'Connor on many occasions and left messages. None of these were answered.

On the 24th May 2016 the Police Licensing Officer hand delivered two identical letters, one to the Lounge Bar and another to Mr Ryan O'Connor's home address requesting an urgent meeting.

On the 25th May 2016 the Police Licensing Officer visited the premise. Mr Ryan O'Connor was not present and the officer spoke with a Mr Steven Reidy. He was asked him to make urgent contact with Mr Ryan O'Connor informing him to contact the police. It was at this time that the cctv was viewed.

On the 26th May Mr Ryan O'Connor attended Grays Police Station to discuss the incident. The Police Licensing Officer discussed the incident and Mr Ryan O'Connor admitted that he had been allowing the sale of alcohol past the terminal hour on his Premises Licence. Agreed at this meeting was that Mr Ryan O'Connor would transfer the Premises Licence out of his name and to vary himself off as the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). This would take place in the near future.

It was very clear that urgent and robust action was required in order to negate a similar incident taking place in the future. The Police Licensing Officer stated that she sought for the following conditions to be varied onto the Premises Licence with immediate effect.

- A minimum of 2 SIA registered door staff will be deployed at the premise every Friday and Saturday from 20:00hrs until the premises closes and all customers have dispersed.
- The Premises Licence Holder shall produce a Search Policy for customers entering the premise. This shall particularly address any issue around weapons and/ or drugs. The Premises Licence Holder shall supply an up to date copy of the Search Policy to the police and the licensing authority.
- Drinking vessels shall be made of toughened glass, or similar, designed to not have a sharp edge when broken.

- All beverages supplied/sold on the premises will be supplied in glass containers as above, or otherwise as agreed with the police. However, this shall not apply to beverages supplied/sold in bottles with a volume of 20cl or less, or 70cl or more.
- The premise shall operate a terminal hour of entry no customers may enter after Midnight.

The Police Licensing Officer asked for this to be completed by close of business on Friday 27th May 2016.

A letter dated 27th May 2016 was sent by the Police Licensing Officer to Mr Ryan O'Connor confirming all the above.

By close of business on the 27th May 2016 no application had been made. The Police Licensing Officer met with Mr Ryan O'Connor at the Licensing Authorities office on Tuesday 31st May 2016 but again no application was submitted.

The Police have over the last 5 months, together with Licensing Officers from the Licensing Authority carried out a number of visits to the premise. It has been apparent during these visits that a number of issues have been found with the operation of the premise. Particularly that on each visit to the premise evidence of drug usage has been found in the toilets of the premise.

Mr Ryan O'Connor only became the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor on the 16th April 2016. He has however for a long period of time been a manager at the premise. The two in-depth Police inspections of the premise since the 16th April 2016 have revealed a serious concern over a number of specifics regarding the operation of the premise. The very serious incident of the 22nd May 2016 raises even greater concerns, again with the operation of the premise.

In the relative short period since Mr Ryan O'Connor has become the Premise Licence Holder he has display a complete disregard for the law in general and the Licensing Act 2003 in particular.

The Police now have a very serious concern over the ability and intention of the Premises Licence Holder to operate within the law and support the Licensing Objectives under the Licensing Act 2003.

The Police have therefore no confidence in the Premise Licence Holder or the management to deal effectively with the operation of the premise. The Police see no prospect of the situation improving.

It follows from this that the Police are calling for a Review of the Premise Licence under the following objectives: Prevention of Crime and Disorder Public Safety The Police response to all of the above all be it over a short period of time has been incremental, proportionate and necessary. The Police see that calling for the review is the final step in this process.

It follows from this that the Police are calling for a Review of the Premise Licence.

I am employed by Essex Police as a Licensing Officer responsible for the Thurrock District. I am attached to the Thurrock Community Safety Hub. The Hub is dedicated, specialist and operates from Grays Police Station. Within licensing there are a number of responsibilities but the most important is the investigation, detection and prosecution of offences under the Licensing Act 2003. A fundamental part of this is the calling for a Review of a Premises Licence or a Club Premises Certificate.

This visit disclosed some issues particularly related to the cctv system and the apparent use of cocaine in the toilets. Following this visit I forwarded a letter to the Premises Licence Holder Mr John O'Connor outlining the issues and the police concerns these raised. I produce this letter as my Exhibit Ref: JC/01.

On the 12th February 2016 I carried a similar visit during which no serious issues were raised. Mr Ryan O'Connor was present at the time and stated to me that the premise would be closing on the 13th February 2016 to allow for a re-fit to commence.

In March 2016 applications were made to Transfer the Premise Licence and to Vary the Designated Premises Supervisor to Mr Ryan O'Connor. At the same time a Minor Variation was submitted to the Licensing Authority part of which was to change the name of the premise from Unit 4 to Lounge Bar. I produce these applications as my Exhibit Ref: JC/02.

On the 15th April 2016 I was part of a police team which carried out an in-depth licensing inspection at the premise. This was carried out under the heading of Op.Benison Tier 1 Inspection. The Police team was accompanied by Licensing Officers of the Licensing Authority and one of these handed to Mr Ryan O'Connor a new Premises Licence which showed him as the Premise Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). I produce this licence as my Exhibit Ref: JC/03. This licence contained a number of conditions. The

inspection proceeded and a number of breaches of the Premises Licence conditions were found. The conditions were contained in Annex 2 of the licence as follows:

Condition No. 3 – CCTV not showing the correct date.

Condition No. 8 – Regular toilet checks not being carried out.

Condition No. 9 – No incident book available.

Condition No. 10 – No Challenge 25 posters being displayed.

It was also noted that no staff training records were available to inspect.

One of the police concerns was the apparent use of cocaine in the toilets. Drug wipes were used and gave a positive reading. Attending police officers noted that the male deputy manager at times seemed over excitable. The police being unsure whether he was simply nervous or possibly under the influence of drugs.

As a result of the visit I drafted a letter dated 19th April 2016 to the Premises Licence Holder, Mr Ryan O'Connor. This letter stated quite clearly the nature of the breaches. I produce this letter as my Exhibit Ref: JC/04.

On the 16th May 2016 I received an e-mail via the Licensing Authority from a member of the public. This related to the operation of the premise. I produce this e-mail as my Exhibit Ref: JC/05.

On the 20th May 2016 I was again part of a police team which carried out an in-depth Licensing Inspection at the premise. This was carried out under the heading of Op.Benison Tier 1 Inspection. The police team was accompanied by Licensing Officers of the Licensing Authority. Mr Ryan was present during the inspection. There had been some improvement since the previous visit but the police still had concerns. During the inspection a number of breaches of the licence conditions were found. The conditions were contained in Annex 2 of the Premises License as follows:

Condition No. 8 – Regular toilet checks not being carried out.

Condition No. 10 - No Challenge 25 posters being displayed.

I made Mr Ryan O'Connor fully aware of these breaches.

Again drug wipes were used in the toilets and a positive reading for the apparent use of cocaine.

At the time it was my intention to follow up this visit by drafting a letter and forwarding it to the Premises Licence Holder. The event of the 22nd May 2016 negated this happening.

On the 22nd May 2016 a very serious incident took place at the premise. I was not on duty at the time but returned to duty on the 23rd May 2016. It was apparent to me that urgent action was needed and I immediately set about attempting to make contact with the Premises Licence Holder Mr Ryan O'Connor. I made a number of telephone calls to him leaving messages but none of these were answered.

On the 24th May 2016 I hand delivered two identical letters address to Mr Ryan O'Connor at Lounge Bar and his home address requesting an urgent meeting. **I produce this letter as my Exhibit Ref No. JC/06.** I received no response.

On the 25th May 2016 I carried out a duty visit to the premise. Mr Ryan O'Connor was not present but I spoke with a Mr Steven Reidy. He informed me that he would pass on my request for an urgent meeting with Mr Ryan O'Connor. I inspected the Incident Book of the premise and for the date of 22nd May 2016 it simply showed "fight" with no further detail. I made it very clear that this was unacceptable and that a comprehensive entry was required. With the assistance of member of staff I then viewed the premise cctv covering the time and day of the incident in question. I checked with the member of staff on three occasions that the time and date shown on the cctv was correct. On each occasion I was told it was. The cctv clearly showed the sale of alcohol on three separate occasions timed at 01:29, 01:42 and 01:53hrs. The terminal hour for the sale of alcohol is 00:30hrs. The premise has a closure time of 01:30hrs.

On the 26th May 2016 I met with Mr Ryan O'Connor at Grays Police Station to discuss the incident. Mr O'Connor produced to me the a number of sheets of paper which contained a full account of the incident of the 22nd May 2016. I asked that this be recorded in the incident book at the premise. A discussion followed during which Mr Ryan O'Connor admitted to me that he sold alcohol past his terminal hour on the night in question. He also stated to me Mr Steven Reidy was in the process of applying for his Personal Licence and that once it was issued he would become the Premise Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor. I asked that these application be processed immediately.

I emphasised the very serious nature of what had taken place and stated that immediate and robust action needed to be taken. I put to him a number of conditions that the police sought to be varied onto his Premises Licence. I informed him that such an application must be submitted at the latest by close of business on Friday 27th May 2016. He agreed to this and stated that all the applications would be submitted by this date.

I drafted a letter dated the 27th May 2016 to Mr Ryan O'Connor, this set out the police concerns regarding the visit of the 20th May 2016 together with the conditions that we had agreed at our meeting. I hand delivered this letter to the premise the following day. No application was submitted. **I produce this letter as my Exhibit Ref No. JC/07**.

On the 31st May 2016 I met with Mr Ryan O'Connor at the Licensing Authorities Office. Ms Liz Cox, Licensing Officer of the Licensing Authority was present. At the conclusion no application was made.

Since this meeting I have received no contact from Mr Ryan O'Connor and no applications have been received.

I write to you in your capacity as Premise Licence Holder of the above.

A visit took place to the premise by Essex Police and Licensing Officers from the Licensing Authority on Friday 15th January 2016.

A number of issues were noted during the visit:

- The CCTV does not cover the exits or entrances to the premise.
- The date shown on the system was incorrect.
- The time was out by 45 minutes.
- Ryan O'Connor stated at the time that staff cannot operate the system and that external sources had to be bought in to do this. (Police downloaded footage themselves last time it was needed).
- The footage was not of good quality.
- Evidence of drug taking was found in the toilets.

I note that the Licensing Authority had cause to write to Mr Ryan O'Connor at the premise on the 27th October 2015 following a similar visit. Advice was given regarding white power found on the toilet roll dispensers requesting that alternative dispensers or some other method be put in place to make it less usable for illicit substances. I would also suggest that regular toilet checks take place to try and prevent this occurring in the future.



The Police would also expect that as a minimum requirement Mr Ryan O'Connor or another member of his team would be able to download CCTV following an incident should it be required.

In the view of the Police Officers that attended the premise they found it to be poorly run and not promoting the Four Licensing Objectives under the Licensing Act 2003. This could ultimately result with the licence being reviewed. This could lead to the hours being restricted, additional conditions being imposed or the licence being suspended or revoked.

The Police therefore expect to see an improvement in the running of the premise when it is next visited.

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

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- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and,
- (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and .

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1). A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2).For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula where-

 $\mathsf{P} = \mathsf{D} = (\mathsf{D} \mathsf{X} \mathsf{V})$

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in

accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 3 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the price permitted on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales and supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1 CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.
- 2 Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.
- 3 Equipment must be maintained in good working order. Recordings must be correctly time and date stamped, kept in good working order, numbered sequentially, kept for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police of Licensing Authority upon reasonable request.
- 4 The Premises Licence Holder must ensure that at all times, the DPS or appointed member of staff is capable of and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format (either disc or VHS).
- 5 The recording equipment and tapes/discs must be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.
- 6 In the event of a technical failure of the CCTV equipment, the Premises Licence Holder/DPS must report the failure to the Licensing Authority by email within two hours of discovering the fault. Any email is to be sent to licensing@thurrock.gov.uk or to an alternative email if so notified by the authority.
- 7 All doors and windows must be kept closed after 23:00 except to allow access and egress.
- 8 Regular checks of the toilets must be undertaken throughout the period the premises is open.
- An incident book must be kept at the premises. This book must be made available to authorised officers of Essex Police and the Licensing Authority and contain the following information:
 a) Times of all toilet checks, details of who has completed them, and any issues found.

b) Details of all incidents that occur inside the premises along with descriptions of persons involved and the action taken.

- 10 A "Challenge 25" policy must be adopted at the premises and all staff will be trained in its operation. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 will be asked for ID and the sale must be refused if they are unable to provide valid identification. Signage must be prominently displayed within the premises to advertise the fact a "Challenge 25" policy is in operation.
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The area to the rear of the premises must be kept clear of customers at all times.



I write to you in your capacity as Premise Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor of the above.

An in-depth licensing inspection took place at the premise by Essex Police and Licensing Officers from the Licensing Authority on Friday 15th April 2016.

Although you had not received your new copy of the Premise Licence which we had with us I would have expected that the new manager would have been aware of the new conditions that were added to it.

The following are breaches of the new conditions:

- CCTV system The new manager "lan" is unable to work the new system. The system is also one day out.
- Regular toilet inspections are not being undertaken. Ian was not aware that he had to.
- No incident book was available.
- No Challenge 25 posters.
- No staff training records were available.

Although doorstaff are not a condition on the licence it is an offence for them to be working the door without a valid SIA badge. Ian had allowed him to work without asking to see his badge which he left at home. Although he was able to show us a picture on his phone of his badge he is not allowed to work without it. You and he are committing an offence by having him on the door. We asked that he be sent home.



It was the view of the attending Officers that Ian did not appear to have a clue as to what he was meant to be doing with such things as the incident book, staff training records and security staff despite being in the industry for 10 years.

Toilets were checked with drug wipes and apart from white powder being all over the floor the wipes showed high traces of cocaine. Ian again had to be told that he needs to conduct regular documented toilet checks throughout the night.

At times Ian seemed to be over excitable and we were not sure if this was because of the police visit and being nervous or if he was under the influence of drugs himself.

To say that the visit was a disappointment is an understatement. I did expect that after the re-fit the police would see a substantial improvement in the running of the business but we saw nothing to convince us of that. It is clear that the Four Objectives under the Licensing Act 2003 and not being upheld. If the premise continues in its present form this could ultimately result in the licence being reviewed. This could lead to the hours being restricted, additional conditions being imposed or the licence being suspended or revoked.

The police therefore expect to see an improvement in the running of the premise when it is next visited.

Thank you for attending the meeting yesterday to discuss the serious incident which occurred in the early hours of the 22nd May 2016 and the in-depth inspection that was carried out on Friday 20th May.

In the early hours on Sunday the 22nd May 2016 a very serious incident occurred this resulted in 3 members of the public receiving very serious GBH injuries (stab wounds). One of these males is still in hospital receiving treatment.

I made various telephone calls to you and left messages but all were unanswered. On Tuesday 24th May I hand delivered letters to your home address and to the premise requesting an urgent meeting.

As I had heard no response from you I visited the premise on Wednesday 25th May to see if staff could contact you and stress the importance of a meeting. I spoke with Steven Reidy who stated that he would shortly be going onto the licence as both the Premise Licence Holders and Designated Premises Supervisor once his personal licence comes through. Whilst I was there I asked to view the cctv which would show the incident of the 22nd May. Although this showed that the fight did not start in the premise but was outside I have concerns regarding the premise still serving alcohol after its time. The sale of alcohol should have stopped at 00:30am but I could clearly see staff continuing to serve at 01:29am, 01:42am and 01:53am. I asked if the time on the system was correct and it was

Confirmed by the software engineer that it was correct. This is a clear breach of the Premise licence.

lasked Steven Reidy that he make contact with you as a matter of urgency.

You contacted me on Thursday 27th May and we met at Grays Police Station. I went through both the serious incident and the inspection visit.

You explained the events of the evening and had completed a full record of the incident which I asked to keep with the incident book.

I put to you that you were allowing sales of alcohol past the time on your Premise Licence and you admitted that you were. I informed you that this was a serious breach of the licence.

I went through all the breaches of the conditions on the Premise Licence and asked that action be immediately taken in regard to these.

We also discussed you role in the running of the premises. You stated that due to financial reason you had had to take on a full time job and were working at the premise of a weekend. I then requested that as Steven Reidy had informed me that he was looking to take over the Premise Licence of the business that as a matter of urgency that this paperwork be completed by close of business on Friday 27th May.

I requested that the following be completed: A Transfer of the Premise Licence to Steven Reidy. DPS variation to remove yourself as Dps and replace. Minor Variation to add additional conditions to the Premise Licence when it is re-issued.

The conditions are attached to this letter.

We then went through the In-depth inspection which took place on Friday the 20th May 2016. The inspection on the 20th May found the following conditions not being complied with. Condition No. 2

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs. There is no camera to the exit of the premises.

Condition No. 8

Regular checks of the toilets must be undertaken throughout the period the premises is open. There were no checks carried out on the day of the visit. Incomplete forms – checks were not being carried out on a regular basis.



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Condition No. 10

A Challenge 25 policy must be adopted at the premises and all staff will be trained in its operation. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 will be asked for ID and the sale must be refused if they are unable to provide valid identification. Signage must be prominently displayed within the premises to advertise the fact a Challenge 25 policy is in operation. No posters were on display.

Both the ladies and the gents toilets were checked with drug wipes and strong traces of Cocaine were found. This is not the first time that we have found this. Officers asked that the toilets are checked on a more regular basis.

The doorman who was on duty was not wearing his badge. He stated that he had lost it but was able to show an Officer from the Licensing Authority his badge on his mobile phone. His badge number was checked on the SIA website and he was allowed to carry on working.

At the conclusion of the meeting I could not stress enough the seriousness of the recent incident albeit that since you became the Premise Licence Holder no incidents had taken place at the premise. All of the above need urgent attention.

If the above applications are not submitted by close of business on Friday the 27th May, the police will have no other alternative but to call for a Review of the Premise Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

On Sunday the 22nd of May 2016, I was on duty in full police uniform in company with Ps 74768 Baker. At approximately 0144 hours a result of information received via my personal radio, I attended The Lounge Bar in Chafford hundred. The incident was reported as a number of people fighting outside the bar and that bottles were being used. Upon arrival I went to the car park at the rear of The Lounge Bar, which is actually the car park to Chafford Hundred train station. Upon arrival there were a large number of people standing just outside the back door to The Lounge bar. There were also a number of groups standing in various placed around the car park itself. Myself and T/Ps Baker were flagged down by a female who stated that her partner had been stabbed and was bleeding from his arm. I know this male to be Torran Dobson. The boot to a vehicle was open, and Dobson was sitting on the sill of this with his arm raised in the air. While speaking to Torran, there were a number of his friends standing with him. I could see that Torran had blood running down his arm, and at one point he removed the bandage which was being used to apply pressure and I could see a large laceration to the underside of this arm. The wound looked as if it had been caused by either a glass or a knife. At this point an ambulance arrived and paramedics started to provide first aid to Torran. At this time I attended the rear of the bar to speak to other officers to try and ascertain what had actually occurred and where the scene of the incident was. While trying to establish this, I became aware of a male who would only give his name as Scott. This male was bare chested and I could clearly see a laceration to his shoulder, which also appeared to have been caused by either a glass or a knife. Finally I was also advised by other officers that a third male victim had been located in an

alley vay near to the incident and that this male had significant injuries to his head and face, and was drifting in and out of consciousness. While paramedics were providing first aid to the officers, I tried to establish where the incident had occurred. I entered The Lounge Bar via the back door, and as I entered I could immediately see that there was a significant amount of blood that had been smeared against the walls of the bar, and that there was fresh blood on the floor of the bar. This indicated to me that the incident had either occurred within the bar, or at some point one of the victims or suspects had been in the bar. As I entered the bar there were a number of members of staff cleaning the floor and walls with mops and buckets, effectively clearing up any potential evidence and compromising the scene. I approached a female bar maid and asked who the manager was and that I needed to speak to him. The bar maid appeared very reluctant to provide details, or very unsure who the manager was, but eventually indicated to a male who was standing at a table within the bar. This male had clearly seen me enter the bar, but at no point had approached me or made himself known as the bar manager. I approached this male, who I now know to be Ryan O'Connor. I asked O'Connor if he was the manager and he confirmed he was in charge of the bar. Due to the fact that there were still members of the public in the bar, as well as staff, I asked O'Connor to join me outside to discuss the incident and establish what had occurred. Myself and O'Connor went outside and I asked him what had happened and where the incident had occurred. O'Connor was extremely vague with the details he provided and provided an account that there was a birthday party in the bar, and that a group of males from London had also been in the bar. O'Connor then stated that he could sense that there was going to be an incident outside the back of the bar, and as a result he came out along with a member of his door staff whose details he only knew as Teo. O'Connor then stated that there was a scuffle between a group of males outside the back of the bar, but that he didn't believe it was particularly significant and that he didn't see any weapons being used. I asked O'Connor to account for the blood inside the bar, and he stated that the male who had provided his name as Scott had returned into the bar after the scuffle, and at that point he realised that Scott may have been stabbed and the blood within the bar was his. During the account I asked O'Connor if there was any CCTV which covered the bar, he told me there was no CCTV that was owned by the bar, and the CCTV camera I had identified outside the back door actually belonged to the hair salon next door. During all the time I was talking to O'Connor, he seemed disinterested in the incident that had occurred and would only furnish information when specifically asked. Due to the extent of the injuries sustained by the victims, specifically the male in the alleyway I found it hard to understand how O'Connor had not

belie ved the incident to be significant, I was also surprised that he was unable to provide me with details of the member of door staff who had been aked to come outside with him, other than a first name of Teo

Having established the scene of the incident, I placed scene preservation on the rear of the bar, even though the area had a number of patrons within the bar. I spoke to O'Connor and advised him that I intended to cordon of the rear are immediately outside the bar until I had spoken to scenes of crime. I asked O'Connor to prevent staff and customers from leaving the bar via the back door until I had spoken to the crime scene manager; however despite this request during the time I was present at the scene at least three members of staff came out of the back door of the bar and into the scene.

Throughout the whole time officers were present at the scene staff within The Lounge bar were not forthcoming with details of what had occurred. Not only myself, but a number of other officers in attendance also entered the bar and asked staff what had occurred, and at no point did any of them provide sufficient details to allow officers to identify suspects or potential witnesses.

These are my original notes made at the time, commenced at 2200 at Brentwood police station.

The following day the 16th of April I entered the document onto the Bacchus database and can produce a copy of this as ASC/2 hence why the document is dated the day after.

In my opinion when visiting the premises it was poorly run and the person in charge didn't appear very professional and was over excitable I am unsure as to whether this was due to the amount of Police present or if he was under the influence of drugs. One of the first checks I conducted was in regards to the security staff on duty. One of them present was not displaying his SIA card as he had left it at home. Other officers part of the team used swabs in the toilet to look for the presence of class A drugs which all came back positive.

The manager present claimed that he had 10 years' experience "in the industry" however didn't appear to have the knowledge to back this up. He claimed to have a over 25's policy but had no material to inform customers of this.

Closure Power (to stop the licensable activity)

Where a constable is satisfied that any premises **are** being used, or within the **last 24 hours** have been used for the unauthorised* sale of alcohol for consumption ON, or in the VICINITY of, the premises he may serve a notice in respect of the premises.

*Unauthorised = in breach of the licence (after hours, not complying with licence conditions, unable to show licence, no summary licence on display etc.).

Notice needs to be served on the person having control of, or responsibility, for the activities carried on at the premises, this is usually a manager or the DPS.

The notice specifies the grounds on which the constable alleges unauthorised sales, states the effect of the notice, specifies the steps to be taken to remedy the breach and that it has immediate effect.

Forms can be found on the alcohol licensing web pages and force forms.

A person commits an offence if he carries on or attempts to carry on licensable activity in breach of the notice.

(S19 & 20 Licensing Act 2003)

DOOR STAFF

Under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; irrespective of any licence condition, a venue which employs door staff etc. **can only** employ appropriate SIA licensed staff.

All door and security staff **MUST** be authorised by the SIA and hold the appropriate licence. There is more than one type of SIA licence, only those holding a door supervisor or close protection licence can act as door security staff.

It is an offence to undertake the role of (or supply) a door supervisor without the appropriate licence (sections 3 & 5)

It is a condition of the licence that it must be worn where it can be seen at all times and it must be produced it to a constable (or authorised person) upon request.

A breach of any the conditions is also an offence under section 9 of the Act, though usually these will be dealt with by the SIA who may revoke or suspend the licence or prosecute the licence holder. The SIA must be informed of any breach.

A licence last only 3 years.

Police officers and police licensing officers (delegated powers) may issue SIA warning notices for minor contraventions of the regulations.

PNC CHECKS

You are advised to undertake PNC checks of door supervisors and personal licence holders (including the DPS). The rationale for this is set out below.

Door Supervisors

A licence condition is that a Door Supervisor must report any conviction or change of address to the SIA; failure to do so is an offence.

It is a valid policing purpose to check therefore if a conviction post-dates the licence issue (ordinarily the SIA will revoke and re-issue a licence for minor offences and revoke for others).

Personal Licence Holders (including DPS)

A Personal Licence Holder is required by law to report to the licensing authority any conviction for a relevant offence. It is an offence not to do so. They must also declare to a court, on first appearance, that they are a PLH so that the court can consider revocation upon conviction.

It is therefore a valid policing purpose to check whether a PLH holds a relevant conviction that post-dates the issue of their licence; so that any offence can be investigated.

PNC Checks Generally

It is advisable that the PNC check is conducted either whilst on the premises or shortly thereafter. Follow up activity can be initiated by the licensing officer subsequently.

Closure Power (to stop the licensable activity)

Where a constable is satisfied that any premises are being used, or within the last **24 hours** have been used for the unauthorised* sale of alcohol for consumption ON, or in the VICINITY of, the premises he may serve a notice in respect of the premises.

*Unauthorised = in breach of the licence (after hours, not complying with licence conditions, unable to show licence, no summary licence on display etc.).

Notice needs to be served on the person having control of, or responsibility, for the activities carried on at the premises, this is usually a manager or the DPS.

The notice specifies the grounds on which the constable alleges unauthorised sales, states the effect of the notice, specifies the steps to be taken to remedy the breach and that it has immediate effect.

Forms can be found on the alcohol licensing web pages and force forms.

A person commits an offence if he carries on or attempts to carry on licensable activity in breach of the notice.

(S19 & 20 Licensing Act 2003)

DOOR STAFF

Under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; irrespective of any licence condition, a venue which employs door staff etc. **can only** employ appropriate SIA licensed staff.

Further to the application made for a review of the above premises licence by Chief Inspector Leigh Norris, Essex Police; I would like to submit a representation on behalf of Thurrock Council's Licensing Department under the licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder. This centres around the Premises Licence Holder's failure to comply with both the permitted hours on his premises licence and the conditions attached to it.

Exhibit JC/03 is a copy of the premises licence which states that on a Saturday recorded music must cease at 00:00, live music at 00:30, sales of alcohol at 00:30 and the premises must be closed by 01:30.

Following the incident in the early hours of 22 May 2016 (which would be classed as the Saturday night for the purposes of the licence), I reviewed the CCTV provided to me by Essex Police, specifically for the period of 01:30 – 02:00. As set out in the Police's evidence, it is clear that the premises is open and trading. There are staff serving behind the bar, money can be seen changing hands indicating that sales are still taking place and customers can be seen dancing which would suggest that music of some description is being played.

Additionally, I attach a statement from Tony Spackling, Principal Health & Safety Officer which provides further evidence of the premises continuing to trade past their permitted hours.

Carrying on a licensable activity (such as selling alcohol) otherwise than under and in accordance with a licence is an offence under s.136 Licensing Act 2003 which upon prosecution could lead to unlimited fine and/or up to six months in prison.

As can be seen from the Op Benison inspections carried out by Essex Police (Exhibits MJH/1, MJH/2, ASC/01& ASC/02) along with PC Hatfield and PC Colbear's INVESTORS IN PEOPLE Gold Page 179 statements there has also been a continued failure by the premises do adhere to the conditions which are attached to the premises licence.

When Mr O'Connor made the application for a minor variation in March 2016, I submitted a representation which asked for additional conditions to be attached to the licence. I attach a copy of this representation as EAC/1. Mr O'Connor agreed to these conditions and they were duly imposed on the licence. The evidence from PCs Hatfield & Colbear demonstrates that there have been breaches of these conditions on more than one occasion. Again, carrying on a licensable activity whilst not complying with conditions is an offence under s.136 of the Licensing Act 2003.

As can be seen from the evidence provided by Essex Police in their review application, there have been numerous attempts to engage with the Premises Licence Holder to ensure the operation of the premises is not undermining any of the four licensing objectives. I have attended meetings with Mr O'Connor in conjunction with Essex Police where assurances have been made about paperwork that would be submitted and the future conduct of the premises, neither of which have been satisfactorily followed through by the premises therefore the Licensing Department fully support Essex Police's application for a review of the premises licence for Lounge Bar.

Further to your recent application for a minor variation to the licence for the above premises, we would like to see the following conditions added to your licence:

- 1.All doors and windows at the premises must be kept closed after 23:00 except to allow access and egress.
- 2.Regular checks of the toilets must be undertaken throughout the period the premises is open.
- 3.An incident book must be kept at the premises. This book must be made available to authorised officers of Essex Police and the Licensing Authority and contain the following information:
 - a.Times of all toilet checks, details of who has completed them and any issues found.
 - b.Details of all incidents that occur inside the premises along with descriptions of persons involved and the action taken
- 4.A Challenge 25 policy must be adopted at the premises and all staff will be trained in its operation. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 will be asked for ID and the sale must be refused if they are unable to provide valid identification. Signage must be prominently displayed within the premises to advertise the fact that a Challenge 25 policy is in operation.

5. The area to the rear of the premises must be kept clear of customers at all times.



In addition, the existing CCTV condition to be replaced with:

- 1.CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.
- 2.Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.
- 3.Equipment must be maintained in good working order. Recordings must be correctly time and date stamped, kept in good working order, numbered sequentially, kept for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police or Licensing Authority upon reasonable request.
- 4. The Premises Licence Holder must ensure that at all times, the DPS or appointed member of staff is capable of and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format (either disc or VHS).
- 5. The recording equipment and tapes/discs must be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.
- 6.In the event of a technical failure of the CCTV equipment, the Premises Licence Holder/DPS must report the failure to the Licensing Authority by email within 2 hours of discovering the fault. Any email is to be sent to licensing@thurrock.gov.uk or to an alternative email if notified by the authority.

The Licensing Department believe these conditions will address concerns regarding the Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

- No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence

 a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
 b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2 Every supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3 (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— .

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or .

(ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); .

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; .

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; .

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

- 4 The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or .
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6 The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and,
- (ii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and .

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

7 (1). A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2).For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula where-

 $\mathsf{P} = \mathsf{D} = (\mathsf{D} \mathsf{X} \mathsf{V})$

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 3 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the price permitted on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales and supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.


