Purpose of Report: To consider the proposal to install a bus stop pole, timetable case and flag sign on the highway outside of no. 244 – 246 Long Lane, Grays, Essex

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is to request approval for a bus stop pole, timetable case and flag sign to be installed on the highway outside no.244-246 Long Lane, Grays. Following a consultation with local residents one objection was received. Approval is sought taking into account the objection received.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1.1 To approve the installation of a new bus stop pole, timetable case and flag sign outside of no. 244-246 Long Lane, Grays, Essex

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND:

- 2.1 Local residents have requested the provision of a bus stop outside 244 246 Long Lane, Grays in order for passengers to be picked up safely.
- 2.2 Residents and ward members have been consulted. One objection was received stating that the bus stop would result in buses stopping directly outside the objector's property producing pollution. However three responses were received supporting the installation of the bus stop.

2.3 Currently, the only bus services on Long Lane are the Ensign number 22 operating between Aveley and Stifford Clays, and the Arriva number 201 operating between Lakeside and Basildon (On Sundays only)

ISSUES AND/OR OPTIONS:

- 3.1 The installation of a bus stop outside no.244 -246 Long Lane would greatly benefit local residents as, currently, the nearest bus stop is over 950 metres further along Long Lane. It is also noted that many residents are elderly and currently have a long walk to the nearest bus stop.
- 3.2 The site outside no.244 246 Long Lane, Grays has been chosen due to its close proximity to the surrounding residential area offering shorter walking distances than would be achievable at any alternative location.
- 3.3 The location was near to the site of a previous bus stop that was removed a few years ago before a bus service was re-instated in Long Lane. However now that the new service is increasing in popularity it is recommended that the new bus stop be installed. Residents living in close proximity of this site are used to having a bus stop here in the past.
- 3.5 The proposed site for the new bus stop is not near any dropped kerbs or driveways and therefore, should not impact on resident's ability to enter/exit their property.
- 3.6 The proposed bus stop would be installed alongside the kerbline and would be some distance from the front gardens and hedgerows of the adjacent properties. Therefore, there is unlikely to be any invasion of privacy.
- 3.7 Funding is available in the current transport programme. It is estimated that the full installation cost will be a maximum of £475.00.

4. CONSULTATION (including Overview and Scrutiny, if applicable)

- 4.1 The residents consultation produced one objection.
- 4.2 Ward members were consulted along with the Portfolio Holder for Housing and Regeneration. No response was received from this consultation.
- 4.3 This item has not been to overview and scrutiny committee

7.1.1 It has been concluded that there is a need for the bus stop to be installed outside no.244 – 246 Long Lane, Grays. It is noted that many local residents are either elderly or unable to walk the distance to the currently nearest bus stop. In addition it has been determined that the bus stop would have no detrimental impact on residents ability to enter/exit their driveways and is not situated near any dropped kerbs. Furthermore, it has been concluded that the bus stop will provide a vital asset to the local community and will promote the use of sustainable and environmentally friendly transport in Thurrock.
