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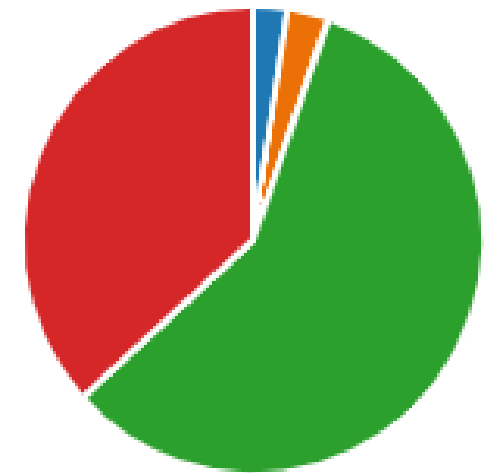
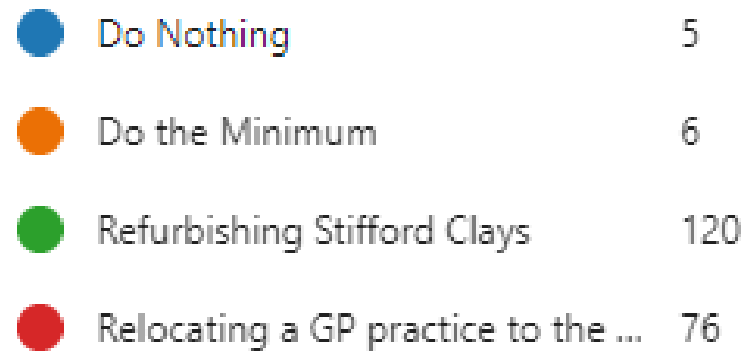


Public Feedback

What the public said for option 1

- I see my MS nurse and get blood tests done at Orsett Hospital due to disabled parking being second to none and close to the facility I need to attend. With any new buildings you provide disabled parking but then expect a person with mobility issues to walk miles to where they need to be. I am unable to walk very far and know you cannot put all services close to the disabled parking.
- Live close to surgery and are happy with current service.
- Spends less money.

What the public said for option 2

- I don't like any of these options. What I feel we need is better access to GP services at the current surgeries and district nurses etc. building a new site just seems a waste of money especially as we once had a walk-in centre which reduced GP budgets and then was closed.
- There should be more minor unit hospitals available for emergencies to take away the pressure from the main A&E hospitals like Basildon, Southend, etc., I can see in the next 10 years, a private emergency A&E hospitals for those who can afford to pay.

What the public said for option 3

- Would prefer to keep as many healthcare facilities in the area to offer contingency and manage growth.
- Less cost by modernising but still large enough.
- My parents are elderly and need a GP service to stay in SC.
- Would be better to refurbish Stifford Clays Medical Centre have more parking spaces and open on a Saturday.
- A much cheaper option than 9.7million for a new centre.
- Do not need more traffic down Long Lane.

What the public said for option 4

- Can't see a GP face to face anyway or get through on the phone to make an appointment so having another surgery will take the workload of the surgeries in Chadwell.
- I am hoping that relocating a GP practice will offer more GPs, more appointments and therefore ease the load on other GPs.
- This seems the most forward-looking option.
- I would like Thurrock to have a centre where you can have; minor surgery, x-rays, blood tests etc. save going to other areas.
- If cost can be met and provide more efficient and future proof service, would be more beneficial in long run.
- More capacity means more resources, means more care!

Main issues raised

- Access – closer to home
- Parking
- 10 repondees who put down option 4 assumed this option would bring more GPs to the area
- Traffic congestion in Long Lane
- Improved care
- Funding
- Public transport
- Value for money

Next steps

Scoring

Scoring session taking account of outcomes from the engagement session to identify the preferred way forward

Care model finalised

- Model of care for the IMWC to be finalised
- Agreement reached on preferred option for location of services
- Agreement reached on how these services will operate to maximise integration

Design and Business Case Development

- Practice to submit a Project Initiation Document (PID) for formal support of preferred option
- Preferred option worked up to provide final floor plans
- Cost estimates sought and Outline Business Case (OBC) developed
